Coming Out of Homosexuality

Clarity and Compassion for the Struggler

I. Introduction

A. The Lost Sheep

"'Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep which was lost!' I tell you that in the same way, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance." Lk 15:4-7

- B. Fruit of the 1960s Sexual Revolution
 - Extra-marital heterosexuality
 - Homosexuality
 - Homosexual "churches"
 - Legalized abortion
 - Homosexual activism (began with Stonewall Inn violent protests, June 28, 1969)
- C. World's View Today
 - Not a moral issue
 - No longer a choice
 - In-born / Unchangeable (key issue most combative over, legal foundation)
 - Civil rights issue (strategy is decriminalization/social acceptance/equality)
- D. Pain and Trouble
 - Disease (sexually transmitted disease, chronic disease, and cancer)
 - Physical trauma
 - Poor quality of life

II. Unbiblical Answers and Critique

- A. Secular Cause Theories (Nature, Nurture, or Combination of both)
 - Nature (cause is said to be biological, in-born) Secular evidence is against unchangeable in-born theories (i.e., unchangeable "gay gene" example).
 - Homosexual gene not found in two decades of intensive research
 - Identical twins do not share the same homosexual orientation
 - Homosexuality shows up and disappears in family lines
 - Homosexuality is reversible, 1 Cor 6:9-11; 2 Tm 2:22

Scripture disproves unchangeable in-born theories.

- "... God is faithful, who will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able ... Therefore, my beloved, flee idolatry." 1 Cor 10:13, 14 Moral commands of Scripture can be obeyed.
- "... and that you be renewed in the spirit of your mind ..." Eph 4:23 God changes lies believed and sinful desires.
- "... Male and female he created them." Gn 1:27; Mt 19:4 People are created by God to be heterosexual.
- "Such were some of you; but you were washed, but you were sanctified, but you were justified . . ." 1 Cor 6:9-11; Gal 5:1; Jn 8:31, 32, 36 People are changed <u>by believing</u>.
- 2. Nurture (cause is said to be external developmental factors, learned behavior) Secular "causes" (nurture theories) are actually provocations to sin out of the heart. Secular "causes" = Provocations to sin. Provocation categories are:
 - Parental
 - Sexual experiences
 - Sibling or peer relations
 - Verbal and physical abuse
 - Heterosexual difficulties
 - Affirmation
- B. Unbiblical Belief Systems
 - 1. Psychotherapy, Col 2:8; Ps 119:113-118
 - Prior to 1973: Cited in DSM* as a mental disorder
 - 1973: Removed from DSM as a mental disorder under political pressure
 - 1975: Released a public statement as not a mental disorder
 - 1994: "Way some of population expresses love and sexuality"**
 - Today: "Coming out and gay community activity needed"**
 - Tomorrow: ?
 - *American Psychiatric Association, *Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders*

**American Psychological Association

- 2. Integrationist therapy
 - Too similar to psychotherapy (training and theories)
 - Sufficiency of Scripture is not believed
 - Polluted nature or idolatry is minimized or ignored as the cause (focus of therapy is the nurture theories)

- 3. Biblical revisionism
 - Overarching claims of scholar-activists "Modern homosexuality"; "loving and committed" relationships; "natural homosexual orientation"; churches are wrong; motive is to maintain male dominance; other O.T. Scriptures no longer binding, so why homosexuality?
 - Example 1: Destruction of Sodom, Gn 19:1-29

<u>Biblical revisionism</u>: Sin is lack of hospitality because this was culturally imperative in the Ancient Near East; passage is not sexual in nature; passage prohibits rape only; pride and neglecting the poor are the sins condemned based on Ezekiel 16:49.

Historical interpretation: The Hebrew word *yada'* translated "have relations with them" is used again in the same story in an unambiguous sexual context, Gn 19:5, 8; the men's sexual lust was homosexual lust, Gn 19:8; Ezekiel describes prosperity leading to pride resulting in "abominations," Ez 16:44-50; cf 2 Chr 26:16; Peter describes an open pattern of sexual immorality and not rape or inhospitality, 2 Pt 2:6-10; Jude describes sexual immorality worthy of eternal judgment, Jude 7.

• Example 2: Marriage as taught by Jesus

<u>Biblical revisionism</u>: Jesus did not condemn homosexuality in the N.T.; He was silent on the subject; Jesus brought a "new commandment" based on love, Jn 13:34, 35.

<u>Historical interpretation</u>: Jesus taught from creation a divinely ordered institution of marriage, Gn 1-2; He upheld heterosexuality and life-long commitment for marriage, Mt 5:27, 28; 19:4-6, 9; Mk 10:5-9; Jesus was love and truth, Jn 1:14, 8:31, 32, 14:6; Jesus is the Creator of the male and female anatomies and biblical marriage, Jn 1:3.

- 4. Affirming "church"
 - Embraces being Christian <u>and</u> an active homosexual
 - Teaches biblical revisionism of homosexual passages
 - Liberal churches [i.e., United Methodist Church, United Church of Christ (UCC), Episcopal Church (U.S.A.), Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), and Evangelical Lutheran Church in America]
 - Homosexual denominations (i.e., Metropolitan Community Churches)
 - Range of acceptance in churches (from ignoring lifestyle, membership, clergy, to marriage)

Metropolitan Community Churches (MCC)

- Church denomination and international movement for "Gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgender persons"
- Founded in 1968 by Troy Perry in Los Angeles
- Claim 43,000 attendees, 300 congregations, and 22 countries (as of 2011)

San Diego MCC

- Another gospel preached, Mk 1:14, 15; Gal 1:6-9 Love and Acceptance preached vs. Repentance and Faith
- Theme of <u>unconditional</u> acceptance as a member
- Promotion of homosexual marriage from the beginning of movement
- Altering of God's gender references in Scripture "Father" is changed to "parent," "I am Israel's parent," Jer 31:9c
- Lord's Supper open to all regardless of faith or being under church discipline

III. Biblical Answers

- A. How to Know Right and Wrong (determined solely by God)
 - 1. God-given conscience
 - All people know homosexuality is wrong in their conscience, Rom 2:14-15a.
 - People will be judged for violating their conscience, Rom 2:15b-16.
 - 2. God's created design
 - By observing human anatomies all people know it is a male-female design.
 - Male-female procreation points to heterosexuality as normative.
 - 3. God's Word
 - Completes knowledge of right and wrong, Gn 1:27, 28; 2:24, 25; Mt 19:4-6.
 - Sense of sin becomes violations of God's law, Ex 20:14; Lv 18:22; Rom 1:25-27; 1 Tm 1:8-11.
 - Fear of punishment becomes specific, Rom 1:18, 32; 1 Cor 6:9, 10.
- B. Cause of Homosexuality
 - 1. Cause of homosexuality is sin; guilty and polluted nature (original sin) results in same-sex idolatry (exchanging truth and worship of God for idols).
 - 2. Direct cause is same-sex idolatry, Rom 1:25-27a
 - 3. Penalty for same-sex idolatry is homosexuality, Rom 1:26a, 27b (God justly lets people experience what they desire)
 - 4. There can be a predisposition to unnatural homosexual desire and differing sinful predispositions in everyone, Jam 1:14
 - Desire stems from a polluted nature, Ps 51:5: Rom 5:12-19, Eph 2:3
 - No one should trust innate desires or be led by desires, Mk 7:21-23; Jam 1:15
 - Jesus was provoked by man and Satan but did not sin, Mt 4:1-11; 1 Jn 3:5 (it is not provocation that causes sin but the polluted nature)
 - Unnatural homosexual desire should remind a person that we are a sinful people

- C. Unassailable Teaching of Scripture is Heterosexual Marriage
 - 1. Creation ordinance, Gn 1-2; Mt 19:4, 5
 - God called marriage between a man and woman "very good," Gn 1:31
 - It was from the beginning; therefore, it remains in effect unless God alone changes it in the N.T., Gn 2; Mt 19:4, 5
 - Principal in which all other passages of Scripture are interpreted
 - Genesis to Revelation teaches heterosexual marriage, Gn 2:24; Rv 19:7 (biblical revisionists point to the trees—passages on homosexuality, but they do not see the forest—all passages on marriage throughout the Bible)

IV. Biblical Counsel

- A. Process of Change
 - 1. Redemption from worshiper of idols to a worshiper of God, Is 55:1-3; Jn 3:3; 2 Cor 5:14, 15; Eph 2:1-9; 1 Thes 1:9; Jam 1:18.
 - 2. May be unclear if professing Christian is a true believer (gospel to be the context throughout the counsel given), Jude 22, 23.
 - 3. Progressive redemption (biblical structure to the change process), 2 Tm 3:16
 - Teaching of truth, Ps 119; Acts 20:20; Rom 15:14; Eph 4:11-13; Col 1:28
 - Reproof of sin (expose the polluted nature, truth suppressed/lies believed, ruling idolatrous desires, and choices/behavior), 2 Sm 1:7, 8; Acts 2:36-40; Gal 6:1, 2; Heb 4:12

Homosexuality is primarily relationship idolatry. Draw out of the struggler additional specific and unique idolatrous desires such as:

Same-sex affirmation/admiration/acceptance/affection Sexual pleasure Same-sex body/body part Friendship/intimacy Independence (from God, Bible, parents, authority) Being in control Hurt-free life Happiness Physical appearance Opposite-sex gender identity Hatred of opposite sex Life cause (activism)

- Correction to truth (repentance and faith), Mk 1:14, 15
 - <u>Repentance</u> with knowledge takes place. A most basic fruit of repentance is a sincere confession, 1 Jn 1:8-10. All homosexual sin and associated sins need to be confessed to God and to others involved, Ps 51:4. Repentance of polluted nature and ruling idolatry is missing from the four unbiblical belief systems discussed above.
 <u>Faith</u> believes the love of God is better and this replaces the love of all other relationships, Lk 14:26; 2 Cor 5:14, 15, 1 Jn 4:19. Believing the truth about homosexual sin, provocation to sin, and redemption from sin always results in worship of God.
- Training in righteousness (biblical and disciplined living broadly taught), Acts 20:31, 32; 1 Tm 4:6-8; 1 Pt 2:1-3
- B. Counsel for Family and Friendships (regarding a friend, minor child, adult child out of the home, or parent leaving family)
 - 1. Remember the gospel in own life, Rom 5:6-10
 - 2. Turn to God and His Word, Ps 56:3, 4; Prv 16:20; Jn 14:15; Jam 1:5-8
 - 3. Speak truth with love, Eph 4:15
 - No truth (weak message or no message, no need to change)
 - No love (harsh, not listened to, perceived as hateful)
 - 4. Type of relationship
 - Actively love, Mt 5:43-48; Jn 3:16; 1 Cor 13:1-7; Gal 2:20
 - Time together not required to revolved around speaking truth, Prv 15:23
 - Evangelistic relationship <u>and</u> genuinely enjoy company
 - Cannot be as close as with a believer, 2 Cor 6:14
 - 5. Be an example of struggling against own sin <u>and</u> pursuing Jesus
 - 6. Loving and redemptive church discipline, Mt 18:12-22
 - If church member and unrepentant (stopped struggling against sin)
 - Grace of the church removed, but not the grace of the family
 - 7. Be watchful and prayerful about potential harm done within family (increased divorce, violence, abandoning faith; effects immediate and extended family)
 - 8. Thank God in all things (1 Thes 5:18)
 - For revealing the true heart
 - For remaining in control of each circumstance
