H. Practical wisdom for increasing income.

- 1. Don't try to circumvent God's way of acquiring wealth.
- 2. Research career opportunities and businesses.
- 3. Assess the job skills God has given you. Gen. 39:2-3 Ex. 36:1
- 4. Increase your marketability by acquiring new skills/certifications.
- 5. You may not be able to pursue your dream career. Pr. 28:19 14:23
- 6. You may have to relocate in order to provide for your family.
- 7. Don't quit one job until you already have the next job.

I. Practical wisdom for those who are unemployed.

- 1. If you are out of work, your full-time job is to get a job. Ecc. 11:6
- 2. Don't merely rely upon sending out your resume' over the internet, or put all your hope in one particular job.
