#### Bringing Healing to Marriages Broken by Sexual Sin

#### **Gender Blending and Confusion**

Behind sexual sins and temptations are often subtle but distorted views of ourselves, the nature of sex, and the character of God. In this workshop we will examine some of these lies and how the gospel breaks through them to reveal that the truth is better than we may think.

## Helping Wives Whose Husbands Struggle with Pornography (women only)

"Helping Wives Whose Husbands Struggle with Pornography" includes giving hope and practical direction to the wife as well as teaching her Biblical resources that God has given to protect her. This workshop also includes a list of fearful/prideful thoughts comparing them to the God-honoring biblical thoughts that she should have. This session ends with an evaluation of further rescues to help the wife.

## Still Sinning After All These Years – A Biblical Theology of Sinful Failure Barbara Duguid | Location: Room 206

If all things work together for the good of those who love God, then even the indwelling sin against which we wrestle each day must somehow benefit us. Since God does all things for his own glory and for the good of his precious children, remaining sin must somehow be good for us and bring God glory. How can this be? How does God's deliberate decision to begin the work of new creation in us while leaving us tied to weak, depraved and very sinful flesh impact us? How can we try hard to obey God's laws and still experience joy, even though we find ourselves falling terribly short day after day? In this session we will look at Paul's struggle with indwelling sin in Romans 7, as well as many other Biblical passages and narratives, to understand God's loving purpose in allowing his beloved children to struggle with so much sin even while they try very hard to obey him.

## Helping Women with Child Sexual Abuse in Their Past: part 1 (women only)

Counseling the sexually abused woman can seem too daunting an endeavor, or become a tangled web of issues for both counselee and counselor in the process. This workshop will unfold a biblical description of typical issues of those who have been sexually abused, and an overview of what typically needs to be accomplished towards the freedom, usefulness, and joy God intends for them and His glory.

### How to Love Christians Struggling with Same-Sex Attraction

#### **Critiquing Evangelical Arguments for Same-Sex Relationships**

Over the last number of years both scholarly and popular level attempts to reinterpret what the Bible says about homosexuality has grown significantly. As biblical counselors we need to understand these arguments, so that we can engage and help those who have been exposed to them.

#### A Battle Plan for Fighting Pornography

Many believers are losing the battle to pornography because they aren't fighting with a biblical plan. This workshop outlines a clear strategy for battling pornography with the sufficient resources found in the Person of Christ and the Word of God.

### Helping Women Who Struggle with Pornography (women only)

"Helping Women Who Struggle with Pornography" briefly explains typical examples of secular and Christian psychology programs, but majors on how to biblically counsel a woman caught up in pornography. There are four phases: Biblical principles on mortifying the flesh; confession and accountability; what to do with the card-catalog of images/romance scenarios that come to mind; and dying to self and becoming consumed with the glory of God. The workshop concludes with recommended and not recommended resources.

## The Advantages of Remaining Sin – Encouraging the Sexual Sinner to Celebrate Christ in the Context of Their Worst Failures

In this session we will apply our theology of sinful failure specifically to counseling and helping believers who long to walk in faithful obedience to Christ but find themselves falling into sexual sin time and time again. We will consider the difference between a rebellious sinner and a weak sinner who hates their sin and repents with godly sorrow, but is unable to break free. How is rebellion different from weakness and what difference does that make in the church and the counseling room? How do we point precious strugglers to Christ, and how does the imputed righteousness of our great Savior provide the greatest motivation of all for obedience and change?

## Helping Women with Child Sexual Abuse in Their Past: part 2 (women only)

To help flesh out the overview of Part one, this hour, Zondra will unfold specific resources useful in counseling those women plagued or hindered by past sexual abuse, and their life responses to it. You won't go away without some effective tools for your counseling toolbox.
